## Two Shall Become One

In many ways, a wedding in Lesotho is quite similar to weddings in America—lots of preparation, fancy clothing, and many happy people! Some customs are very different though.

Most weddings in Lesotho are two-day events. The first day's celebrations are typically held at the bride's home, and the service includes both a sermon and the wedding ceremony. The second day is at the groom's home where a second sermon is preached, followed by the bride being welcomed into his family. Usually the houses will be scrubbed and even freshly plastered in honor of the occasion. Then extended family and friends will come in and cook, decorate and get everything ready throughout the night before the wedding. No invitations are necessary in Lesotho, and a big feast is prepared for everyone on both days!




